## **SUMMARY**

## **CPIH**

The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) is the most comprehensive measure of inflation. It extends the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) to include a measure of the costs associated with owning, maintaining and living in one's own home, known as owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH), along with council tax. Both of these are significant expenses for many households and are not included in the CPI.

Aside from including owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH) and council tax, CPIH is otherwise identical to CPI. This means that, aside from these two components, the factors contributing to the CPI rate are the same as those contributing to the CPIH. For example, if food is reported as increasing the CPIH rate, it is also acting to increase the CPI rate. The size of the contributions for components other than OOH and council tax are exaggerated in the CPI compared with the CPIH because they account for a larger proportion of the overall index.

The <u>National Statistics</u> status of the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) was reinstated on 31 July 2017. <u>A letter</u> from the Director General for Regulation to the National Statistician detailed the actions that were taken to meet the requirements as set out in the <u>CPIH</u> assessment report.

The main movements for CPIH in September 2018 are:

- The all items CPIH is 106.6, up from 106.5 in August.
- The all items CPIH annual rate is 2.2%, down from 2.4% in August.
- The annual rate for CPIH excluding indirect taxes, CPIHY, is 2.1%, down from 2.3% last month.
- The OOH component of CPIH is 105.9, up from 105.7 in August.
- The OOH component annual rate is 1.0%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPIH all goods index is 104.9, up from 104.1 in August.
- The CPIH all goods index annual rate is 2.5%, down from 2.7% last month.
- The CPIH all services index is 107.9, down from 108.3 in August.
- The CPIH all services index annual rate is 2.0%, down from 2.2% last month.

#### **Consumer Prices Index (CPI)**

The CPI continues to be a National Statistic and is a measure of consumer price inflation produced to international standards and in line with European regulations. First published in 1997 as the



Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP), the CPI is the inflation measure used in the Government's target for inflation.

The CPI is also used for purposes such as uprating pensions, wages and benefits and can aid in the understanding of inflation on family budgets. For more information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for CPI in September 2018 are:

- The all items CPI is 106.6, up from 106.5 in August.
- The all items CPI annual rate is 2.4%, down from 2.7% in August.
- The annual rate for CPI excluding indirect taxes, CPIY, is 2.4%, down from 2.7% last month.
- The annual rate for CPI at constant tax rates, CPI-CT, is 2.3%, down from 2.6% last month.
- The CPI all goods index is 104.9, up from 104.1 in August.
- The CPI all goods index annual rate is 2.5%, down from 2.8% last month.
- The CPI all services index is 108.6, down from 109.2 in August.
- The CPI all services index annual rate is 2.3%, down from 2.5% last month.

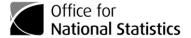
## **Retail Prices Index (RPI)**

In accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007, the Retail Prices Index and its derivatives have been assessed against the Code of Practice for Official Statistics and found not to meet the required standard for designation as National Statistics. The <u>full</u> <u>assessment report</u> can be found on the UK Statistics Authority website.

The RPI is a legacy measure of UK inflation that continues to be published because of its use in long-term contracts and index-linked gilts. For further information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for RPI in September 2018 are:

- The all items RPI is 284.1, down from 284.2 in August.
- The all items RPI annual rate is 3.3%, down from 3.5% last month.
- The annual rate for RPIX, the all items RPI excluding mortgage interest payments (MIPs), is 3.3%, down from 3.4% last month.
- The all goods RPI is 215.1, up from 213.9 in August.
- The all goods RPI annual rate is 3.2%, down from 3.7% last month.
- The all services RPI is 388.6, down from 391.3 in August.
- The all services RPI annual rate is 3.3%, up from 3.1% last month.

#### Large downward effects came from:

- Food and non-alcoholic beverages, where prices fell by 0.1% between August and September 2018 compared with rise of 0.8% between the same two months a year ago. The main effects came from meat where prices fell between August and September this year but rose a year ago and from chocolate;
- Transport, with passenger transport fares showing larger price falls between August and September 2018 than between the same two months a year ago. The largest effect came from sea fares with a smaller downward effect from air fares. Within transport, there was a further small downward effect from motor fuels. Petrol prices rose by 1.7 pence per litre between August and September 2018 compared with a larger rise of 2.5 pence per litre between August and September 2017. Similarly, diesel rose by 1.5 pence for the same period this year compared with 2.5 pence a year ago. These



effects were partially offset by a small upward contribution from second-hand cars where prices rose by more than a year ago;

- Recreation and culture, where the contributions came from cultural services, in particular from theatre admission prices which fell this year but rose a year ago, and from games, toys and hobbies, specifically from computer games. These games are heavily dependent on the composition of bestseller charts, often resulting in large overall price changes from month to month. There were partially offsetting small upward contributions from computer software, tablet computers, DVDs and package holidays; and
- Clothing and footwear, with average prices rising by 3.1% between August and September 2018 compared with a rise of 3.9% between the same two months a year ago. This downward effect came principally from women's clothing with smaller downward contributions from children's clothing and women's footwear. There was a partially offsetting upward movement from menswear.

#### Small downward effects came from:

- Furniture, household equipment and maintenance, where prices were little changed between August and September 2018 but rose between the same two months a year ago; and
- Restaurants and hotels, where prices overall rose by less than a year ago.

## A large upward effect came from:

 Housing and household services, where prices for electricity and gas rose between August and September 2018 but were unchanged between the same two months a year ago.

#### Small upward effects came from:

- Miscellaneous goods and services, with small upwards effects from appliances and products for personal care and from house contents insurance, where prices rose this year but fell a year ago; and
- Communication, where mobile phone charges rose between August and September 2018 but fell a
  year ago.

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, with the main downward contributions coming from continental meats and sausages.

#### **Fish**

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago.

## Sugar, jam, syrups, chocolate and confectionery

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, with the main downward contributions coming from cartons/boxes of chocolates and large bars of chocolate.

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago.

## **Fuels and lubricants**

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year by less than a year ago.
- The average price of petrol across the month, as recorded for the CPIH, rose by 1.7 pence per litre between August and September 2018, to stand at 130.3 pence per litre.
- Last year, the average price of petrol rose by 2.5 pence per litre between August and September 2017, to stand at 118.2 pence per litre.

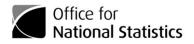

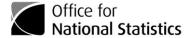

Diesel prices rose by 1.7 pence per litre, to stand at 134.3 pence per litre in September 2018, compared with a larger rise of 2.5 pence per litre last year, to stand at 119.9 pence per litre; and
  - **Vehicle tax and insurance**, where average car insurance premiums rose this year by less than a year ago.
- Partially offset by purchase of motor vehicles, where prices overall rose this year by more than a year ago, with the main upward contribution coming from second-hand cars.

## RECONCILIATION OF CPIH AND RPI

## (Table 5a of the Consumer Price Inflation Dataset)

This table identifies the main factors contributing to the differences between the unrounded inflation rates for the CPIH and the RPI. These differences are broken down into: mortgage interest payments, other housing components excluded from the CPIH, imputed rents (included in CPIH and excluded from RPI), other differences in the coverage of goods and services, and the formula effect. The final column titled 'other differences including weights' is derived as a residual.

The corresponding figures for the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) can be found in Table 5b in the Consumer price inflation dataset.

The difference between the CPIH and RPI unrounded annual rates in September 2018 was -1.07 percentage points, widening from -1.05 percentage points in August 2018.

The main factor contributing to the widening was:

• Other differences including weights, which increased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPIH 12-month rate by 0.10 percentage points between August and September 2018. The effect came mainly from sea fares; games, toys and hobbies and equipment for sport and open-air recreation; clothing and footwear; and air fares. This was partially offset by food and non-alcoholic beverages; and furniture and furnishings, carpets and household textiles.

The main offsetting factors were:

- Mortgage Interest Payments, which decreased the RPI 12-month rate by 0.05 percentage points between August and September 2018 but are excluded from the CPIH.
- The formula effect, which decreased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPIH 12-month rate by 0.04 percentage points between August and September 2018. The effect came mainly from recreation and culture.

## **Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels**

- British Gas has announced a 3.8% increase in its standard variable tariff (SVT), with effect from 1 October. The average bill will rise by £44 to £1,205 a year. (britishgas.co.uk 8 August 2018)
- ScottishPower has announced its domestic standard variable gas and electricity prices are to increase from 8 October 2018. Standard dual fuel prices will increase by an average of 3.7%.

## **TRANSPORT**

#### **Fuels and Lubricants**

- OPEC sees the oil market as well supplied and is wary of creating a glut next year, the
  group's secretary-general said on Thursday, suggesting producers are in no rush to expand
  a June agreement that raises output. Oil prices have rallied this year on expectations that
  U.S. sanctions on Iran will strain supplies by lowering shipments from OPEC's third-largest
  oil producer. Brent crude LCOc1 last week reached \$86.74, the highest since 2014.

- When considering the price of petrol between September and October 2018, it may be useful to note that the average price of petrol fell by 0.9 pence per litre between September and October 2017, to stand at 117.3 pence per litre as measured in the CPIH.
- A 1 pence change on average in the cost of a litre of motor fuel contributes approximately
   0.02 percentage points to the 1-month change in the CPIH.

## **HOUSING (RPI)**

## Mortgage interest payments (MIPs)

- The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.75% on Thursday 13 September 2018. The next announcement and minutes from the Bank of England's Monetary Policy Committee are scheduled to be published on 1 November 2018.
- The change in average mortgage interest rates recorded in the RPI was -0.02 percentage points between September and October 2017. The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.25% in September 2017.
- A one percentage point change in the average mortgage interest rate contributes approximately 1.0 percentage points to the 1-month percentage change in the RPI.



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
